## Winterizing Your Formula Boat


- Due to the varied makes and models of engines used in Formula boats, engine winterization will not be addressed in this guide. The factory advises that the appropriate engine manufacturer's instructions be followed for engine winterization.
- The factory uses a non-toxic recreational vehicle and marine-grade antifreeze rated at least -50° F for the water system and -100° F for the engines.


## Water Tank & System


- To drain the water holding tank, open any faucet and allow the water to run until the water tank is empty. If this operation puts water into the waste holding tank, that tank must also be pumped out and winterized.
- Depending on the capacity of both the water tank and the water supply lines, fill the tank with the appropriate amount of -50° non-toxic recreational antifreeze.

  Open the faucet the greatest distance from the boat's water tank (usually the transom shower). Keep the faucet open until the liquid coming out is a bright pink. Close the faucet and continue on to the next faucet. If the head unit uses fresh water, be sure to cycle it until the bright pink liquid is in the bowl. If the boat is equipped with a port-a-pot, be sure to empty the holding tank and put antifreeze into the tank.
- NOTE: The water holding tank does not require filling to capacity. Add enough antifreeze to fill the lines and allow a small amount to remain in the tank.
- Once the water supply lines have antifreeze in them, turn the water system circuit breaker OFF. Add additional antifreeze to the sink drain(s) to ensure they are protected. This operation will also ensure the holding tank is protected.
